Poznan - city of education




Tips for international offices – outgoing participants

- ✓ Information provided from the University for participants It helps in the organisation of the mobility (webpage, email, posters, leaflets, Erasmus+ meetings, information on the student's radio, step by step instructions)
- ✓ Information given from the participants to the University (it may help the participants in the difficult situations beforehand)
- ✓ Transparency of the recruitment of the participants
- ✓ Crucial role of the reports



Tips for international offices – incoming participants

- ✓ Courses in English for incoming students
- ✓ Events for the international community
- ✓ Help of the students Erasmus Student Network buddy programme (social events, trips, Christimas meetings)
- ✓ Collaboration with a local community, city council
- ✓ Presence in the social media, FB fanpage, online competitions





Tips for international offices – other observations

- √ Taking part in the Erasmus+ events, exchanging ideas
- ✓ The process of internationalization is a common interest of the University, not only of the international office. It requires the effort of the whole academic community

Challenges

- ✓ All the information provided both in English and Polish language (foreign participants)
- ✓ Individual approach to students/staff vs growing numbers of mobilities
