Over **80,000** young people, youth workers, students, academic staff and young professionals will benefit from Erasmus+ exchanges



3rd EaP Youth Forum – June 2017 Recommendations

Youth organisations: raise awareness of voluntary service and benefits of active citizenship

EU: open European Solidarity Corps to EaP

National governments:

- social entrepreneurship into national youth policies
- entrepreneurial learning as horizontal subject
- train, employ and promote self-employment





Key Action 1: Mobility of individuals – three modalities

- Youth exchanges, age 13 to 30, duration 5 to 21 days

- Mobility of youth workers, 5 days to 2 months

- Volunteering projects, age 17 to 30, duration 2 to 12 months



Key Action 1: Mobility of individuals – involvement of Partner Countries

E+ national agencies of Prog. Countries can allocate up to **25%** of their budget for coop. with neighbouring countries

6,500 Ukrainian young people and youth workers have participated

You can be partners but only organisations from Programme Countries can apply.

<u>Current calls close on 1 February, 26 April and 4 October</u> 2018



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Strategic partnerships

Proved added value of participation from Partner Countries

- SPs supporting innovation
- SPs supporting exchange of good practices

- Transnational Youth Initiatives: carried out by youth, foster social commitment and entrepreneurial spirit

Call close on 1 February, 26 April and 4 October 2018 <u>You can be partners but only organisations from</u> <u>Programme Countries can apply.</u>



Three ongoing SP with Ukrainian organisations [see *E*+ *project results*]

- **Peace and Love Vector**, on integration of refugees, with Center for Euroinitiatives (Sumy) - Swedish coord.

- **The Voice of History**, with Centrum Kultury Polskiej i Dialogu Europejskiego (Iwano-Frankiwsk) – Polish coord.

- *Improving youth employment through volunteering across Europe*, with Iskra (Mykolaiv) – *Portuguese coord*.

EU4Youth – Targets for 2020

- 300 Civil Society Fellowships for youth

- Partnerships for Entrepreneurship and transnational cooperation **projects**

- Support for **100** youth organisations and organisations addressing youth issues

- Reduce skills / labour market demands **mismatch**

Extensive and well-developed **partnerships** with:

- Local authorities
- Local employers
- NGOs

Support for **disadvantaged** groups

Gender equality and promotion of **women** as leaders and entrepreneurs



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Key Action 2 & Component 1: Capacity Building

- Empower young people with key competences & skills
- Citizenship, entrepreneurship, leadership
- Targets: youth organisations, youth workers, leaders

How: calls for proposals by European Commission's EACEA, applicants must be established in EaP countries Current call open until 8 March 2018



Examples of capacity building activities

- Policy dialogue, cooperation, networking and exchanges, conferences, workshops, meetings

- Large-scale youth events
- Information and awareness campaigns

- Youth work methods, tools and materials, curricula, training modules, documentation instruments



Eastern Partnership Youth Window

Combines **capacity building** and **mobility** *through:*

- Civil Society Fellowships for Youth
- Partnerships for Entrepreneurship



Civil Society <u>Fellowships</u> for Youth

Mobility included: Young leaders from EaP countries gain experience in organisations in Programme Countries

Mentoring schemes, job shadowing

Youth policy engagement projects upon return



Partnerships for Entrepreneurship

Focus on entrepreneurship education and social entrepreneurship

Solution to social challenges in communities of origin

Involvement of the private sector

Possible mobility activities



EaP Youth Window – 2017 selection process

- Civil Society Fellowships for Youth 60% of funds, 58 applications, 20 projects selected

- Partnerships for Entrepreneurship 40% of funds, 61 applications, 15 projects selected

Total: 119 applications, 35 projects selected, €3.43 m



EaP Youth Window – Results by country

35 projects, 186 organisations from 32 countries 124 organisations from Programme Countries 52 organisations from EaP:

- 16 from Georgia
- 12 from Ukraine
- 9 from Moldova
- 8 from Armenia
- 6 from Belarus
- 1 from Azerbaijan



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Grant scheme for policy development

Improve educational and training opportunities, employment perspectives of **disadvantaged** youth

Support young people's entrepreneurial **ideas** in appealing **sectors**: IT, creative industries, green economy, social ent

Actions with potential systemic **impact**

Involvement of **private** sector
