Jean Monnet – How does it work?

<u>Action grants to promote excellence through:</u>

- Teaching and research (Modules, Chairs, Centres of Excellence)
- Policy debate with academic world (Networks, Projects)
- Support to activities of Associations





Teaching and research in the field of EUstudies

• MODULES

Min 40 teaching hours/year (max grant: € 30.000)

• CHAIRS

Chair Holder: Min 90 teaching/year + at least 1 additional activity/year. (max grant: € 50.000)

CENTRES OF EXCELLENCE

Focal points of competence and knowledge (max grant: € 100.000)

Policy debate and exchanges

NETWORKS:

foster creation, development of consortia of international players (HEIs, Centres of Excellence, departments, etc.) in area of EU studies.

Involvement minimum 3 partner institutions from 3 different countries, 3-year grants; (max grant: € 300.000)

PROJECTS:

support innovation, cross-fertilisation, spread of EU content. Involvement of other partners possible, duration 12 - 18 - 24 months; (max grant: € 60.000)

Support to Associations

Support to Associations:

contribute to the study of the EU integration process, interdisciplinary approach, officially registered and independent; open to all interested professors, teachers and researchers specialising in EU issues, at regional, national or supranational level; 3-year grants; (max grant: € 50.000)

Duration: 2015 - 2018

Jean Monnet Selection Results 2017

- Applications received 1177
- Selected projects 228
 198 projects with Jean Monnet funds, € 11 million
 30 projects with PI funds, € 3 million

Acceptance rate ~ 20%

Next Call for Proposals 2018

- Publication of the Call on 2018 EAC/A05/2017 on 25 Oct in 2017
- Application via eForm and 3 attachements: (Project Description, Budget and DoH)
- Participant Portal / Participant Identification Code (PIC)
- Deadline for applications: 22 February 2018 at 12:00 CET
- Budget: around € 12 million + € 3,5 Million for certain Partner Countries
- Starting date of projects: 01/09/2018





How to apply?

- Apply directly to Executive Agency (EACEA)
- Applicants from <u>all</u> countries
- Applicants: HEIs or organisations active in EU subject area, depending on the action type
- HEIs in E+ Programme countries >>> ECHE
- Only one applicant institution is required / except Networks

How to apply?

Applications must be submitted using the eForm with attachments

1. Applicant organisation (for Networks also partner institutions) be registered in Participant Portal and receive Participant Identification Code (PIC)

- 2. Create official electronic application form (eForm)
- 3. Fill in eForm
- 4. Attach completed versions of different attachments to the application/e-form
