International (credit) mobility

- Short-term studies or traineeships abroad (2-12 months) that count to a degree back home
- At bachelor, master and doctoral level...
- ...and for staff – teaching/training/retraining/in-service training (5 days – 2 months)
- Grants to cover travel and living costs
- HEIs from EU MS and associated third countries may apply to their National Agency
- Opportunity for preparation of new projects for other actions and piloting your CBHE project results

Erasmus Virtual Exchange in Higher Education and Youth

About Virtual Exchange

Virtual Exchange is different from other forms of online learning:

- 1 It is **technology-enabled** and uses the broad reach and scope of new media technologies to bring geographically distant people together.
- 2 The focus is primarily on **people-to-people** real-time dialogue in which participants learn from each other, as opposed to content-driven learning.
- 3 Face to face interactions are **facilitated** by trained facilitators or educators to ensure they are meaningful and explicitly address the intended learning outcomes of intercultural understanding.
- 4 The exchange is **sustained** over time, designed as a pedagogical process.

In short, it provides a virtual learning space where young people are encouraged to share experiences, build relationships, and collaborate.

What Makes it Unique

Scalability and inclusivity

→ Expanding the reach and scope of physical exchange programmes.

Experiential learning

→ Building and enhancing intercultural competencies by experiencing first-hand communication and collaboration with people with different ideas and backgrounds.

Community of trust

→ Providing a safe space where young people feel heard and respected, and develop the confidence to think critically about their own perspectives.

Learner-led approach

→ Empowering young people to lead the dialogue, seek mutual understanding and co-create knowledge, based on their own experiences.



The Erasmus+ Virtual Exchange project proposes different models of Virtual Exchange activities with different formats, duration, time investment, thematic scope and number of participants.

Which option is best for you?

Some exchanges are open for young people, while others are designed to be integrated as part of existing courses or activities offered by universities, schools or youth organisations.

Erasmus Virtual Exchange in Higher Education and Youth

Objective: The specific objectives of this call are the following:

- encouraging intercultural dialogue and increasing tolerance through online people-to-people interactions, building on digital, youth-friendly technologies;
- promoting various types of virtual exchanges as a complement to Erasmus+ physical mobility, allowing more young people to benefit from intercultural and international experience;
- Enhancing critical thinking and media literacy, particularly in the use of internet and social media, such as to counter discrimination indoctrination, polarization and violent radicalisation;
- fostering the digital and soft skills development of students, young people and youth workers, including the practice of foreign languages and teamwork, notably to enhance employability;
- promoting citizenship and the common values of freedom, tolerance and non-discrimination through education;
- strengthening the youth dimension in the relations of the EU with third countries.
- Partnership: min. 2 organisations from Programme Countries and 2 from Partner Countries
- Open for HEIs and organisations working with youth.
- Duration: 2-3 years. Budget for the region: 750 000 euro



Erasmus Mundus Design Measures (EMDM)

COMING SOON

- New sub-action, supporting the design of high-level study programmes at master level
- An EM Design Measures project involves at least 3 full partner HEIs from three different countries, of which **at least two must be EU Member States or Associated third countries**
- Independent call for proposals
- Fixed duration of 15 months. Grant – 55 000 Euro
- Institutions from **all over the world** may submit a proposal on behalf of an international consortium



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🚩 Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters (EMJM)



- Excellent integrated Master courses offered by consortia of 3+ full partner HEIs from three different countries, of which **at least two must be EU Member States or Associated third countries**
- Attract best students worldwide through EU-funded scholarships
- Duration: 6 academic years covering at least 4 editions of the master programme
- 1 to 2 academic years (60, 90 or 120 ECTS credits) with **study in 2+ countries, of which at least one must be an EU MS or Associated third country**
- Institutions from **all over the world** may submit a proposal on behalf of an international consortium

Capacity building for higher education

- 2-3 year Partnerships of HEIs from 2 different Programme Countries and not less from Partner Countries (balanced)
- Three types of projects:
 - FOSTERING ACCESS TO COOPERATION IN HE:
 - smaller scope projects focused on universities – priority to newcomers - €200-400k
 - PARTNERSHIPS FOR TRANSFORMATION
 - larger-scale projects focused on innovation, university/business and governance € 400-800k
 - STRUCTURAL REFORM PROJECTS focus on the macro level (policy reforms to foster internationalisation) and require involvement of ministries. € 800k -1 Mln.

- Balanced involvement and clear benefits for all participating third country HEIs not associated to E+

Multi-country

- Relevance of the proposal: needs to be common to all third countries; clear justification for involvement of more than one Region in a cross-regional project
- Balanced involvement and clear benefits for all participating third country HEIs not associated to E+ and third country HEIs not associated to E+ HEIs
