Partnership Opportunities

1. Erasmus+ mobility actions decentralization approach and flexibility for partnership rules and approaches
2. An opportunity for HEIs (particularly for Ukrainian) to enforce a right for organizational, financial and academic autonomy
3. An opportunity for self-evaluation of study programmes and defining modernization needs
4. Increase of foreign language competence level of staff and students
5. Formation of basis for institutional internationalization culture
6. Building institutional capacity via professional sphere and research competences development
7. Development of digital and green competences
8. Learning by practice – teaching and studying
9. Improvement of teaching & learning methods
10. Learning to cooperate with external stakeholders (for student&staff internship placements)
11. Modernization of study programmes
12. Design of joint/double diploma programmes
13. Joint research&publication initiatives
14. Joint international youth initiatives
15. Guest lecturing by invited companies, international organizations to share a value-added experience
16. Effective combination of various mobility formats: physical, online, blended

Partnership Characteristics

1. E+ Programme principles and requirements
2. National legislation of Ukraine regulating a right for learning mobility
3. EU & UA HEIs development and internationalization strategies, priorities and institutional needs
4. EU & UA HEIs policies and procedures on international projects implementation
5. Recognition and institutionalization of mobility results for staff and learning outcomes for students

Partnership Features during the war

1. Martial law in Ukraine (after 24.02): limitations for staff and students – men of 18-60 years old (with exceptions for certain groups)
2. NEW Regulations of the KМУ on learning mobility outlining peculiarities for learning mobility during the martial law in Ukraine
3. Destroyed HEIs, relocated HEIs, limited or no access to institutional buildings, documentation
4. SECURITY: close location to severe military activities, danger of missile attacks all over Ukraine
1. Clearly formulated needs, opportunities and limitations of Ukrainian HEIs
2. EU Directives and national regulations on temporary protection for Ukrainians fleeing from the war

1. Intensification of all mobility related processes
2. Verification and confirmation of effective partnerships
3. Formulation of further cooperation perspectives
4. Challenges in management and financial tools to ensure Erasmus+ exceptional measures in relation to the war in Ukraine and specific exceptional adaptations of Erasmus+ programme rules
5. Digitalization of education processes
6. Active cooperation with stakeholders to intensify support to Ukrainian HEIs
7. Consideration of inclusiveness, internal migration immigration issues in mobility
