War-Induced losses and challenges of Ukrainian Education during martial law* (since 24.02.2022)



Severe damage of the educational ecosystem:

- Human losses among students teaching and admin staff
- 3798 education institutions damaged, 365 destroyed completely
- War affected 1.5 million young Ukrainians, over 70,000 foreign students
- Many HEIs have served as shelters and humanitarian hubs
- International officers and projects teams&families under danger in occupied territories
- 34 HEIs, 65 units of HEIs and 45 VET institutions temporarily relocated
- Teaching and learning process: from shelters, frontlines and abroad (online/offline/blended formats)
- Sirens, electricity cuts, long-term blackouts and its consequences (days/nights)
- Emotional burnout among students and teaching staff
- Enrollment campaign 2025 will be a big challenge for many HEIs
- Brain drain and other impact on youth in Ukraine – [new publication](#)

- ✓ Erasmus+ projects with russia and belarus are terminated (5th Package of sanctions)
- ✓ The cooperation with organisations funded by the state budget is NOT eligible
- ✓ The individual opportunities for russians/belarusians* are still eligible if applicable.
- ✓ Based on its Academic/organisational autonomy it is up to the Erasmus Universities and other organisations on how to apply it.
- ✓ At least make sure that they share European values and do not support war! It is nothing to do with politics!
- ✓ **Please do the right choice – choose people from Ukraine, we are defending the future of Europe!**
- ✓ **PLEASE DO NOT** provide similarities via joint **support** platforms for Ukrainians, Russians, and Belarusians: do not equal those suffering from a bloody war with those whose **governments directly support war and terrorism – ‘victims of war’ ≠ ‘victims of totalitarian regime’.**
- ✓ Ukrainians are not refugees – not refused by our country... but temporary relocated internally/abroad.
- ✓ **Stop recognition of russian diplomas, they are not in Bologna Process any more!**
- ✓ **Do not put students and staff from Ukraine and from Russia/ belarus* in one event – do not traumatize!!!**
- ✓ **ALWAYS INFORM ABOUT PRESENCE OF THEIR REPRESENTATIVES WELL BEFOREHAND!!!**
- ✓ **WE ARE NOT YET READY TO ANY BRIDGES AT THIS STAGE – RESPONSIBILITY AND JUSTICE FIRST!!!**

Many decades ago, the international community decided to stop large-scale deaths of civilians during wars and armed conflicts. Thus the rules of war were created, which forbade the killing of civilians, the infliction of harm and torture on prisoners, and the launching of lethal weapons into unprotected settlements.

Despite the fact that the rules of war are set out in international treaties such as the Geneva Conventions, the Rome Statute, and other international laws and agreements, many of which Russia is a signatory to.

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Education is resilient – continue teaching and study

Education process restarted on **14 March 2022** in distance/blended/offline!!!

- ✓ 24 regions of Ukraine are providing education in distance learning format!
- ✓ 12 – in blended format online/offline: strong solidarity among institutions!!!
- ✓ 34 higher education institutions, 65 HEI affiliated units and 45 professional pre-higher educational institutions were displaced.
- ✓ 167 professional pre-higher and higher education institutions were damaged, and 24 institutions were destroyed.

562 290 students applied for higher education in 2023
71 786 students confirmed for budget funding in 2023.
1,4 mln. students applied for higher education in 2024.

Universities strengthened their internationalisation priorities and widened cooperation, opened campuses!

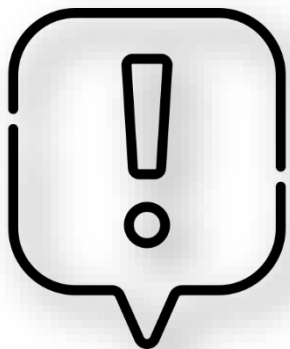

Recognition of Academic (Credit) Mobility and Qualifications



Recognition of higher education qualifications within the Higher Education system is carried out in accordance with the Law on Higher Education - by the decision of the Academic Council of the HEI.



Within Erasmus+ projects, Inter-Institutional Agreement is a MUST to organise official mobility and recognition of learning outcomes and mobility periods.

Recommendation: to have internal mobility regulations to avoid internal risks regarding the recognition of learning outcomes.

Bologna Process implementation and key reforms (2014 -2019)



- **The Law on Higher Education** ([2014](#) with amendments 2017-2024):
 - **4 cycles:**
 - PhD / Doctor of Arts (3rd cycle, 8th level of the NQF)
 - Master (2nd cycle, 7th level of the NQF)
 - Bachelor (1st cycle, 6th level of the NQF)
 - Junior Bachelor (short cycle, 5th level of the NQF)
 - **European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS)**
 - **QA system in line with ESG**
 - **Academic, organisational, personnel autonomy** (no financial autonomy yet)
 - **National Qualification Framework**
 - **Diploma Supplement**
 - **Competence-based and student-centred approaches, Learning Outcomes**
 - **Academic Mobility and Joint programmes**
 - **National Agency for Higher Education Quality Assurance** (established in 2016, operated since 2019)

Bologna Process implementation and key reforms since (2014-2019)



- **Law on Education** (2017) with (amendments 2018-2024):
 - **National Agency for Higher Education Quality Assurance (NAQA)** fully operational since 2019
(4000+ accreditation experts pool and about 7000 study programs accredited by 2024)
 - **National Qualification Framework (NQF)** is harmonized in line with QF EHEA and EQF LLL
 - **National Qualification Agency** (2019) responsible for NQF, professional standards and Qualification Recognition



Bologna Process implementation and key reforms since 2014



➤ 2019-2022

- NAQA prepared for entry into ENQA/EQAR
- PhD reform – adoption of a new legal framework for dissertation defenses and PhD study
- **Strategy for the Higher Education Development in Ukraine – 2032** (approved on February 23, 2022, the Cabinet of Ministers) is developed in line with European Integration prospects as well as EHEA principles.
- Regulation on **Mobility** (updated in May 2022, the Cabinet of Ministers) – internships (for practical skills development) and language internships were added as forms of academic mobility, the right to mobility was extended to VET students.
- **List of Fields of Study and Programme Subject Areas in Higher Education** based on the Fields of Education and Training 2013 (ISCED-F 2013) (updating in 2022, the Ministry) – 29 Fields of Study (Narrow fields of education and training, ISCED) and 122 Programme Subject Areas (Detailed fields of education and training, ISCED)

Current Higher Education reforming in Ukraine (2024)

- Law on Amendments to the Law of Ukraine “**On Higher Education**” on **Individualized Learning Pathway** (approved, 2024): expanding the opportunities of students to form the individualized learning pathways, as well as expanding the autonomy of HEIs in the development and implementation of interdisciplinary educational programs, recognition of non-formal/informal education
- Law on Amendments to the Law of Ukraine “**On Higher Education**” on expanding the rights of **student self-governance** bodies and ensuring the **rights of students**
- **Law of Ukraine “On Academic Integrity”** (1st reading, 2024)
- **Law of Ukraine “On National Qualification system”** (approved, 2024)
- On April 2, 2024 the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine adopted a resolution "[On Amendments to the Rules for Crossing the State Border by Citizens of Ukraine](#)"



Higher Education reforming in Ukraine

- State funding for HEIs based on criteria (2024)
 - **contingent of students** - the total number of students who study at the expense of the state funding
 - **research activity** - the amount of funds (calculated per academic employee) that HEI earned from the provision of research and consulting services or received in the form of grants for research
 - **internationalization** — place in international University ranks and/or participation in Erasmus+ projects
 - **employment** — the percentage of graduates who are employed (data from the Pension Fund)
 - **regional coefficient** — to support HEIs in the most vulnerable, currently front-line regions

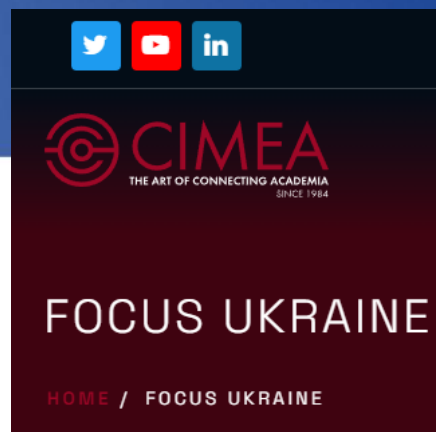



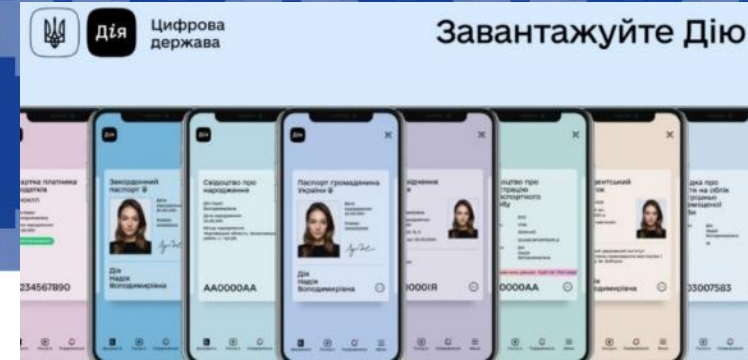

Impact

The main impact of the project was the provision of targeted and specific support to the participating countries to establish ESG-compliant QA agencies and to thereby improve the country's implementation of the Bologna Key Commitment on QA. The project therefore had a direct impact on supporting the EHEA and the collaboration of HEIs within it since it tackled the work of QA agencies (and thus the related HE systems within which they operate) that are not yet compliant with the ESG.

Challenges for cooperation under Mobility Projects



- To find contact information of the HEIs for mobility/ cooperation
- Force Majeure Circumstances: suspend or continue with redesigning
- Staff safety, activities delays, changes, workplan/ activities etc.
- Institutional regulation for Mobility does not reflect the war time: not ready for flexibility
- Recognition by the EU universities of prior study or belonging to the university without the documents which were lost/destroyed during war/ recognition for mobility periods
- Study/Traineeship for 1st year students, 4th year students longer semester, exam, diploma
- Ad hock courses and not relevant to the subject area (impossible to recognize)
- Teaching, Training, Job shadowing for staff (focus on institutional impact)
- Delays with documents for permission to staff, researchers and students mobility
- Crossing the border procedures for specific categories of students and staff
- Passport, visa and crossing the border during martial law
- Temporary protection status vs students visa etc.

RUSSIA'S WAR ON UKRAINE: UKRAINIAN STUDENTS IN THE EU



Russia's invasion of Ukraine on 24 February 2022 has caused vast displacement of people within the country as well as across the EU borders. While the annexation of Crimea had a negative impact on the country's education system, recent events have added additional strain.

Outbound **student mobility** was already substantial in recent years, but it has accelerated even further since the Crimean conflict began. After doubling from some 25 000 to nearly 50 000 between 2007 and 2014, the number of Ukrainian students abroad has since skyrocketed by another 54 % to around 78 000 in 2019.

Approximately 49 000 Ukrainian **students** were attending various higher education institutions across the EU in 2019. This means that approximately 60 % of the 78 000 Ukrainians studying abroad worldwide in 2019 chose to study in the EU. The countries welcoming the highest numbers of students are Poland, Germany, Czechia and Slovakia.

Some 480 Ukrainian students are currently engaged in Erasmus+ activities via the programme's international strand. In the 2015-2019 programming period, **Ukraine** received 40 % of the available funding in the Eastern Partnership region, and over 9 000 Ukrainian students and staff participated in more than 1 300 Erasmus projects.

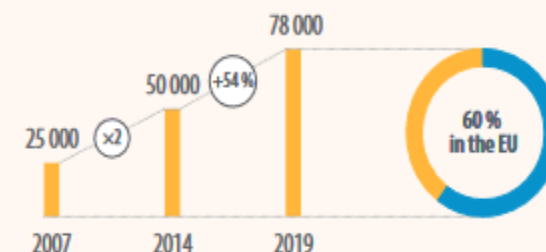
Following the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Commissioner Mariya Gabriel announced, on 2 March 2022, that the Commission would grant maximum flexibility in the implementation of Erasmus+ projects involving Ukrainian

higher education students and staff. National Erasmus agencies can apply the *force majeure* clause for international mobility activities taking place in Ukraine and Russia. This will allow beneficiaries to cancel, postpone or rearrange planned activities in the most flexible way possible.

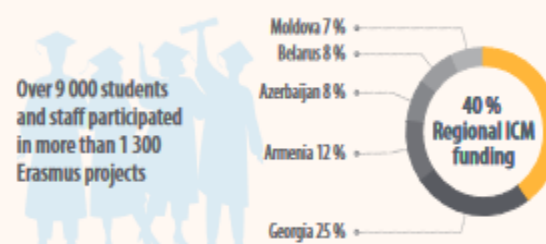

Number of young people studying worldwide



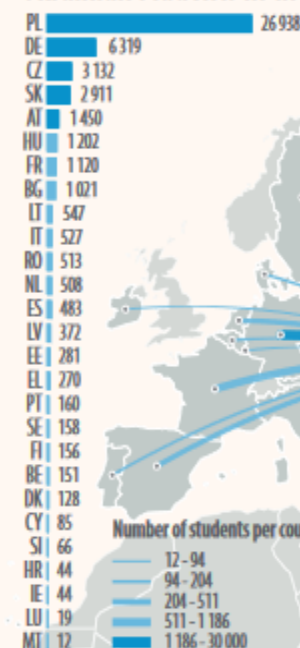

Needs: Erasmus+ Programme level

- High need to respond the war and crises challenges and their consequences: create the Urgency Envelope. Relocation of funds remained from other regions on the decentralised actions into this envelope to respond Emergencies. It will lead to optimisation and more effective usage of unspent funds.
- Erasmus 'zero' grant for mobility could be a practical mechanism to enrol the students into the courses at the EU universities, where relevant, with the temporary protection status funding (if available). Explain the specifics for the relevant authorities what is it.
- To increase the budget for the Erasmus+ Actions for overall capacity building in education, youth and sport for countries under transformation into and smooth integration to the potential status of the 3rd Country Associated to the Programme based on the similar approach done for the Western Balkans Countries for 2021-2027.

- To consider opening of Jean Monnet and international mobility for school, Teachers Academy, create capacity building in school education for pre-accession countries – to join smoothly EEA! Mobility in sport and Non-forProfit Events opening!
- There is a strong cohort of the innovative Universities and organisations capable to fulfil the criteria of the value added who built their capacities within EU's Programmes.

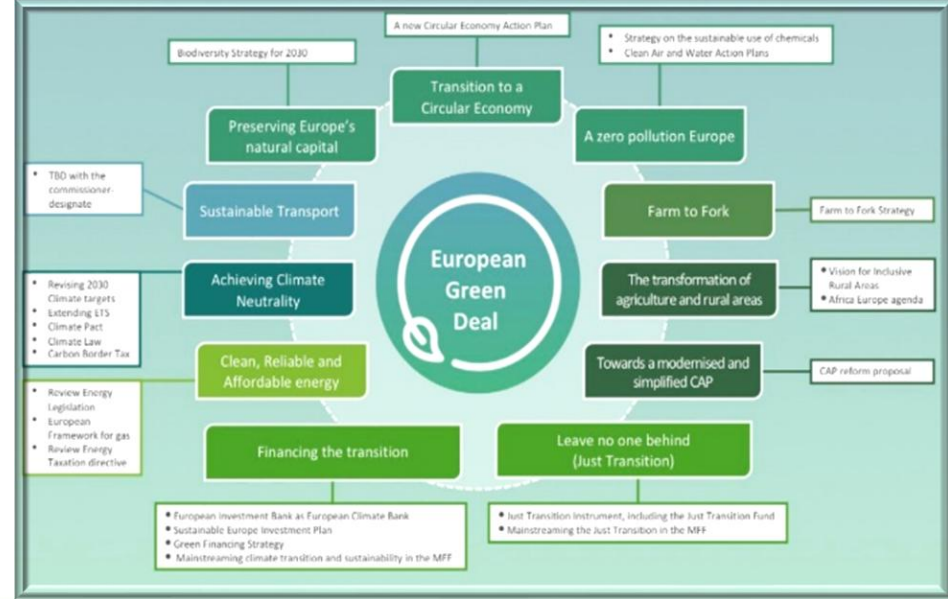

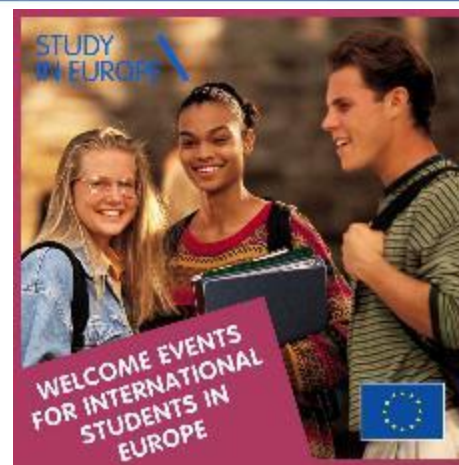

Steps for changes and impact – KA1. ICM, VET, EVE, Youth

1. **Mobility** projects – building trust at personal, institutional levels and Ukraine!!!

- Establish contacts and discuss cooperation, learn how to present your institution, how to communicate about your university/organisation needs (SWOT).
- Learn how the international cooperation is organised, what procedures and mechanisms are established, learn how to write proposals and do it together.
- Bring prominent lectures for internationalisation at home, organise joint virtual classes, youth dialogue via virtual exchanges!
- Learn how the educational process/work with youth is organised what are the digital tools to make it operated easier!
- Additionally: arrange meetings with other universities, faculties, youth organisations¢ers, authorities find contracts for future partnership etc.
- Organise a meeting with students – promote Ukraine and your HEI as study destination!
- Organise summer/winter schools for youth people, including students – youth dialogue

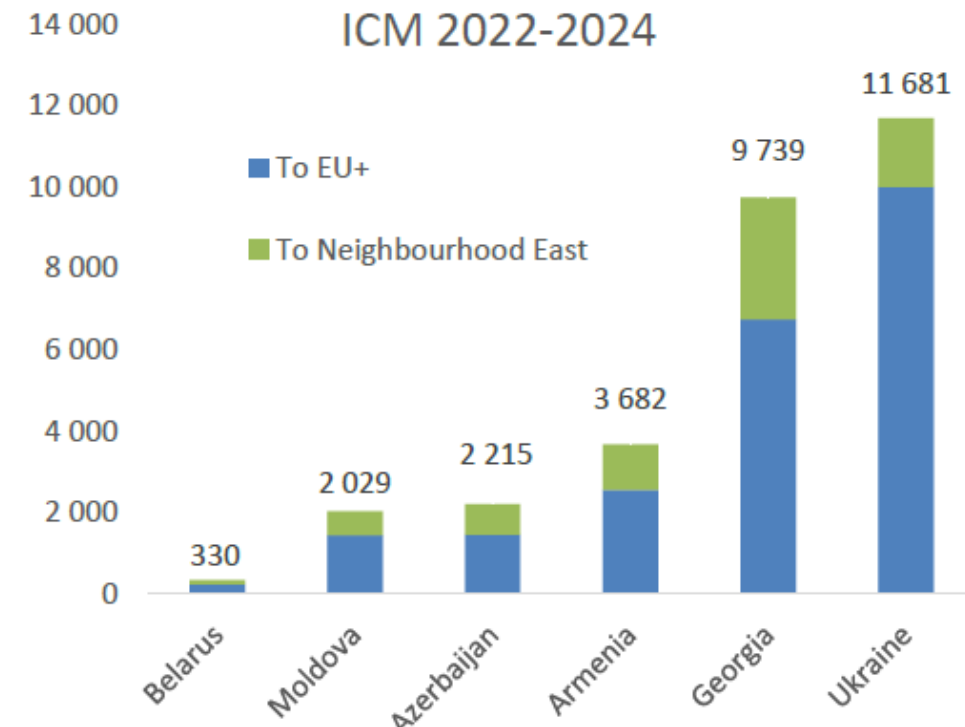
