8 years and 811 days (14.05.2024)

A new reality for the "certificate of birth" for a kid from Ukraine, if her parents are killed or if Ukrainian kids died, kidnaped or get lost....



- 584 children are killed, more than 1337 are injured, 19546 illegally deported

This data does not include information from areas where the active hostilities take place.

- 10 378 civilians are killed, plus over 100 000 in Mariupol (tbc)
- 19 632 civilians are injured
- 17.7 mln. people in need
- Over 3 mln. Ukrainians were forced to go to russia
- 3 mln. people: in the territories under invasion
- 11.98 million people displaced due to the war
- over 18,8 mln. crossed the border, 11,7 to EU; 5,3 mln. returned
- 6,5 mln. abroad; 3,5 mln. internally displaced people
- out of 10.5 mln. young people in Ukraine: 4 mln. are displaced!
- 3798 education institutions have suffered bombing and shelling
- 365 educational institutions have been destroyed completely
- 101 youth centers have been destroyed or occupied

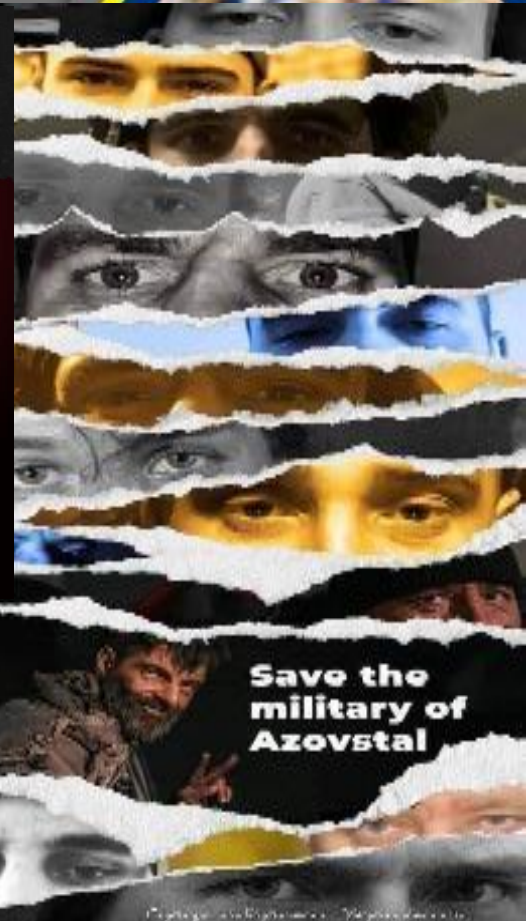

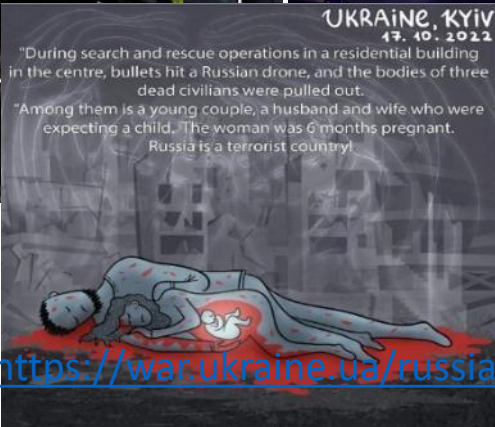

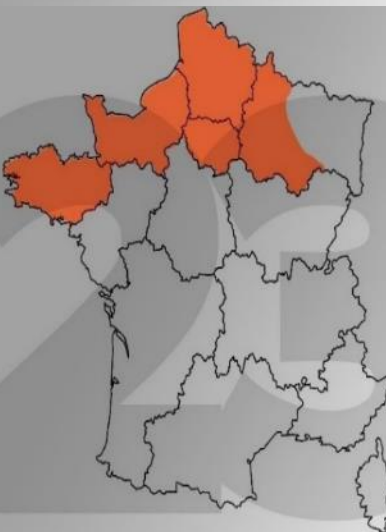

- **All Ukraine is under attack every day and night!!! Kyiv in May – over 500 attacks**
- Cities, towns, villages, homes, critical infrastructures are destroyed and damaged!
- Ukrainian cities/villages in the East and South are under brutal invasion and bombs!!!
- E.g. Mykolayiv – city in the south of Ukraine was NOT bombarded only 29 days, **KHERSON....**
- Over 1000 hospitals and 600 cultural heritage centers are damaged/destroyed
- Travel/Evacuation within Ukraine/out of Ukraine – not safe and limited
- Access of the teachers, researchers and academics to job – limited/absent
- Access of the students to institutions – limited/absent
- Staff/students and documents – not available/ destroyed/relocated
- Educational institutions infrastructures for digital/blended education – partially not available/destroyed/relocated

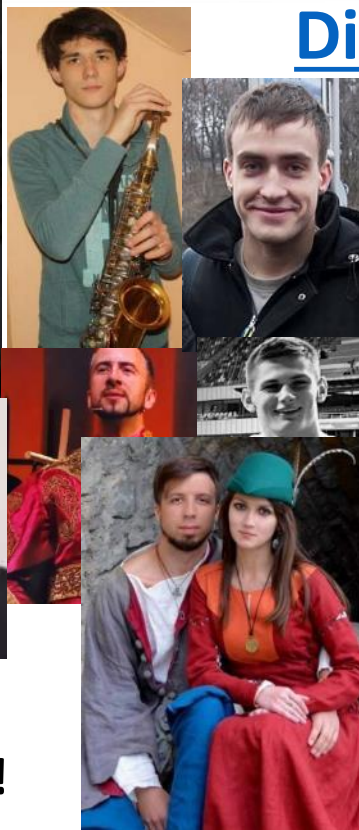

Unissued Diplomas

When your classroom turns into a battlefield, your major becomes brave.

We created this exhibition to remind the world about the ongoing war and the price Ukrainians pay daily in their fight for freedom. "Unissued Diplomas" honours the memory of Ukrainian students who will not graduate because their lives were taken by the Russian invasion.

The "Unissued Diplomas" exhibition uncovers the stories of 36 Ukrainian students killed in the war. It is held at 70+ universities worldwide since the 24th of February 2023, which marks the anniversary of the day all Ukrainians woke up to explosions.

These stories have deeply moved professors, students, parliamentarians, and various European countries. In addition to Ukrainian and English, the stories of the killed students were also conveyed in French, Japanese, Danish, and Finnish.

While we would like to bring this project to a close, Russia continues to take the lives of our peers.

Every day Ukrainian youth, students and staff are defending the identity, values and humanity strongly, protesting in front of tanks and guns in the cities under invasion, **loosing their life defending Ukraine and Europe with bravery instead of enjoying life, studying, living and Erasmusing!**

At the same time russians* benefiting form the opportunities abroad!!!

Majority of russian HEIs benefited from EU's Programmes since 1993

- russians who behaved unhuman torturing Ukrainians, raping and killing women and kids were already educated in the period of Bologna Process implementation in russian education and under active cooperation between

EU and russian universities, staff, students and young people!!! **WHERE IS THE IMPACT?**

- 280 rectors of universities from russia signed a letter in support of the russian aggression against Ukraine!!! Those russians who are abroad remain pro-putin **MUST** be deported back to russia!!!

Ukraine introduced sanctions for cooperation with organisation from Russia in all fields!!!

Erasmus+ projects with russia and belarus are terminated!

The cooperation with organisations funded by the state budget is NOT eligible

The individual opportunities for russians/belarusians* are still eligible if applicable.

Based on its Academic/organisational Freedom it is up to the Erasmus Universities and other organisations on how to apply it.

At least ask the attitude to the russian war against Ukraine when they apply/arrive...it is nothing to do with politics!

Please do the right choice – choose people from Ukraine, we are defending the future of Europe!

PLEASE DO NOT provide similarities via joint **support** platforms for Ukrainians, Russians, and Belarusians: do not equal those suffering from a bloody war with those whose **governments directly support war and terrorism** – ‘victims of war’ ≠ ‘victims of totalitarian regime’.

***Without any prejudice to the nationalities issues!!!**

Ukrainians are not refugees – not refused by our country... but temporary relocated internally/abroad.

Stop recognition of russian diplomas, they are not in Bologna Process any more!

Do not put students and staff from Ukraine and from Russia/ belarus* in one event – do not traumatize!!!



Education in Ukraine is resilient

- Education Institutions are working at their place or were relocated!
- Academics, researchers and students: in the military and territorial defense, humanitarian aid and educational&research forces!
- Teaching and learning process: from shelters, frontlines and abroad!
- Volunteering in hospitals, restoring Bucha, Irpin and other emergencies!!!
- Educational institutions and youth centers in Ukraine have become humanitarian aid hubs!
- Schools, VET and Higher Education Institutions have redesigned and shared their campuses to serve as shelters for the internally relocated people in parallel with educational process!
- International partners support at individual, institutional, national and international levels
- Students and staff who are temporary abroad: humanitarian help, science and education diplomacy, study for Ukraine to rebuild after victory – Ambassadors of Ukraine and their institutions in world!



Erasmus+ projects teams redesigned activities to respond challenges!!!

Education is resilient – continue teaching and study

Education process restarted on **14 March 2022** in distance/blended/offline!!!

- ✓ 24 regions of Ukraine are providing education in distance learning format!
- ✓ 12 – in blended format online/offline: strong solidarity among institutions!!!
- ✓ 34 higher education institutions, 65 HEI affiliated units and 45 professional pre-higher educational institutions were displaced.
- ✓ 167 professional pre-higher and higher education institutions were damaged, and 24 institutions were destroyed.

562 290 students applied for higher education in 2023

***Over 71 786 students confirmed for budget funding
1,053 students in higher education in 2023!***

Universities strengthened their internationalisation priorities and widened cooperation!

Impact

The main impact of the project was the provision of targeted and specific support to the participating countries to establish ESG-compliant QA agencies and to thereby improve the country's implementation of the Bologna Key Commitment on QA. The project therefore had a direct impact on supporting the EHEA and the collaboration of HEIs within it since it tackled the work of QA agencies (and thus the related HE systems within which they operate) that are not yet compliant with the ESG.

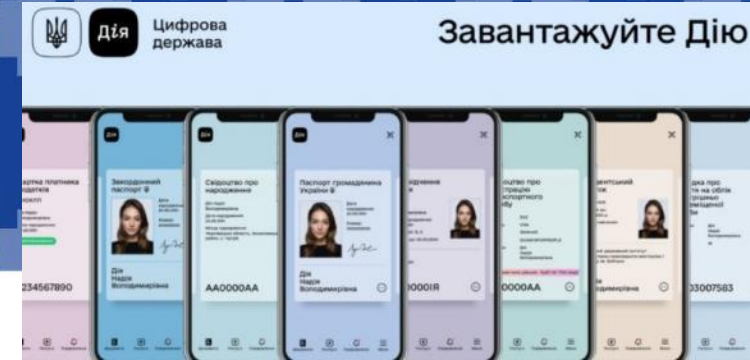

Challenges for cooperation under Mobility Projects



- To find contact information of the HEIs for mobility/ cooperation
- Force Majeure Circumstances: suspend or continue with redesigning
- Staff safety, activities delays, changes, workplan/ activities etc.
- Institutional regulation for Mobility does not reflect the war time: not ready for flexibility
- Recognition by the EU universities of prior study or belonging to the university without the documents which were lost/destroyed during war/ recognition for mobility periods
- Study/Traineeship for 1st year students, 4th year students longer semester, exam, diploma
- Ad hock courses and not relevant to the subject area (impossible to recognize)
- Teaching, Training, Job shadowing for staff (focus on institutional impact)
- Delays with documents for permission to staff, researchers and students mobility
- Not transparent procedure of crossing the border for specific categories of students and staff
- Passport, visa and crossing the border during martial law
- Temporary protection status vs students visa etc.

RUSSIA'S WAR ON UKRAINE: UKRAINIAN STUDENTS IN THE EU



Russia's invasion of Ukraine on 24 February 2022 has caused vast displacement of people within the country as well as across the EU borders. While the annexation of Crimea had a negative impact on the country's education system, recent events have added additional strain.

Outbound **student mobility** was already substantial in recent years, but it has accelerated even further since the Crimean conflict began. After doubling from some 25 000 to nearly 50 000 between 2007 and 2014, the number of Ukrainian students abroad has since skyrocketed by another 54 % to around 78 000 in 2019.

Approximately 49 000 Ukrainian **students** were attending various higher education institutions across the EU in 2019. This means that approximately 60 % of the 78 000 Ukrainians studying abroad worldwide in 2019 chose to study in the EU. The countries welcoming the highest numbers of students are Poland, Germany, Czechia and Slovakia.

Some 480 Ukrainian students are currently engaged in Erasmus+ activities via the programme's international strand. In the 2015-2019 programming period, **Ukraine** received 40 % of the available funding in the Eastern Partnership region, and over 9 000 Ukrainian students and staff participated in more than 1 300 Erasmus projects.

Following the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Commissioner Mariya Gabriel announced, on 2 March 2022, that the Commission would grant maximum flexibility in the implementation of Erasmus+ projects involving Ukrainian

higher education students and staff. National Erasmus agencies can apply the *force majeure* clause for international mobility activities taking place in Ukraine and Russia. This will allow beneficiaries to cancel, postpone or rearrange planned activities in the most flexible way possible.

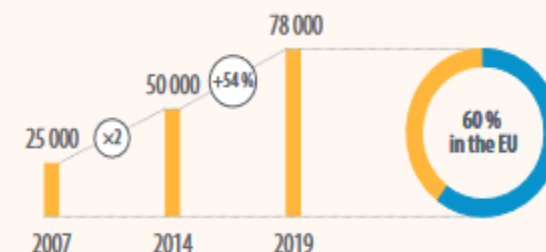
In addition, the Commission has invited Erasmus national agencies and participating organisations to contact beneficiaries who are currently located in Ukraine or Russia

or who are planning to move to these countries in the coming weeks, to explore all options. In all cases, Ukrainian students abroad will be offered assistance tailored to their needs, to ensure their safety.

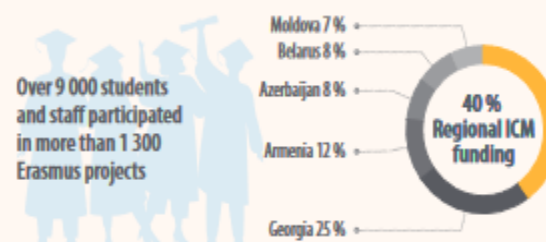
Ukrainian students worldwide

Number of young people studying worldwide

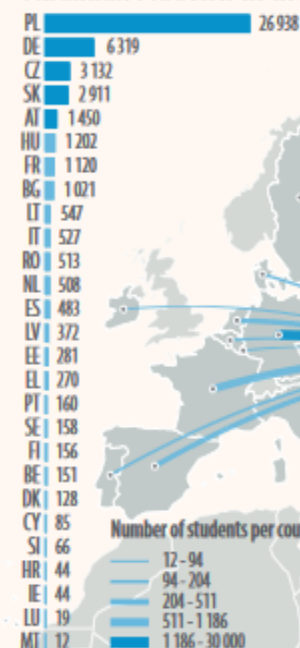

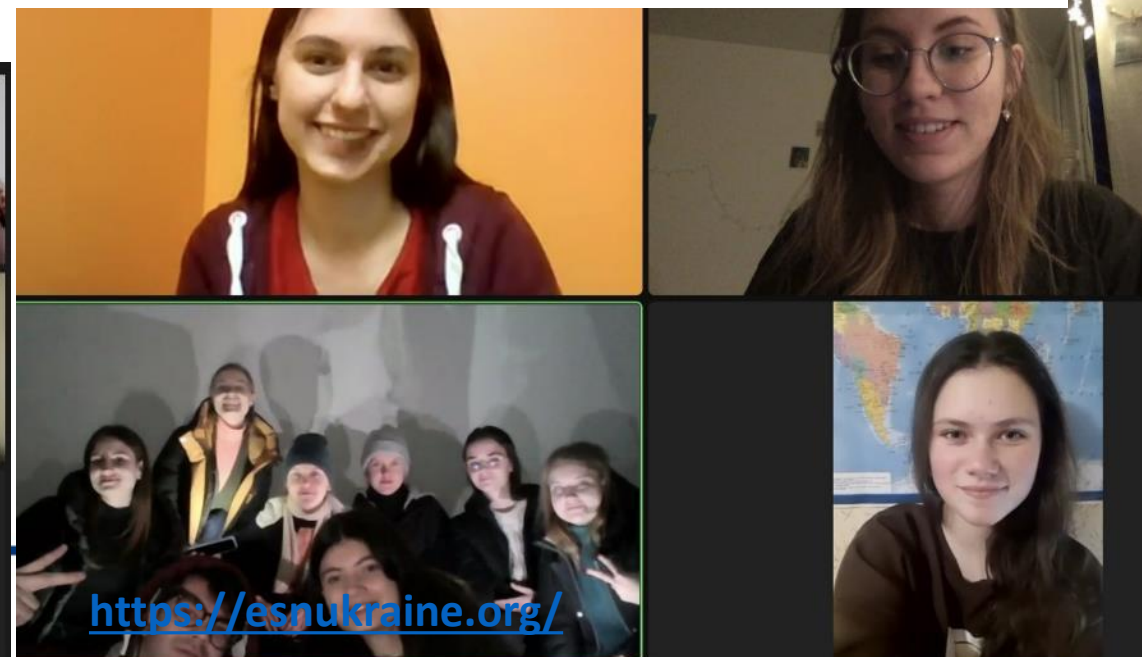

The key areas of international cooperation between universities in wartime are the quality of higher education and research and ensuring equal access to quality education (inclusion), primarily through the digitalization of higher education. These areas are in line with the priorities of the EU and the Erasmus+ Program in higher education. Therefore, reforming such aspects of university activities requires the modernization of governance and management in higher education, the improvement of learning and teaching based on the study and implementation of national and European best practices.

For Ukraine, the urgent task is to build strategies for the post-war reconstruction of various sectors of the economy in the context of European integration and their implementation, so the role of universities as drivers of the development of an innovative society, research and expert centers is significant. Thus, university cooperation in the fields of research and innovation, in particular their commercialization, as well as the development of human capital, is extremely necessary to achieve the goals and objectives of the post-war reconstruction of the country.

A separate focus of international cooperation in higher education should be focused on the field of health care, as it is critically important to develop the latest approaches and methods for diagnosing and treating war victims, both military and civilian, often in a remote mode; physical and psychological rehabilitation of adults and children under martial law.

- High need to respond the war and crises challenges and their consequences: create the Urgency Envelope. Relocation of funds remained from other regions on the decentralised actions into this envelope to respond Emergencies. It will lead to optimisation and more effective usage of unspent funds.
- Erasmus 'zero' grant for mobility could be a practical mechanism to enrol the students into the courses at the EU universities, where relevant, with the temporary protection status funding (if available). Explain the specifics for the relevant authorities what is it.
- To increase the budget for the Erasmus+ Actions for overall capacity building in education, youth and sport for countries under transformation into and smooth integration to the potential status of the 3rd Country Associated to the Programme based on the similar approach done for the Western Balkans Countries for 2021-2027.

- To fund more projects to Ukraine under the selection stage of 2024 calls on the Capacity Building in Higher Education, Capacity Building in VET, Youth and other Actions by redistribution of the relevant Russian Federation budget due to the applied sanctions.
- In the calls 2025-2027 to open more opportunities for piloting partnerships with Ukrainian Universities as full and equal partners in the European Universities Alliances, Small-Scale Partnerships Projects.

- To consider opening of Jean Monnet, international mobility for school teachers/pupils and capacity building in school education for EaP partner countries – to join smoothly EEA!

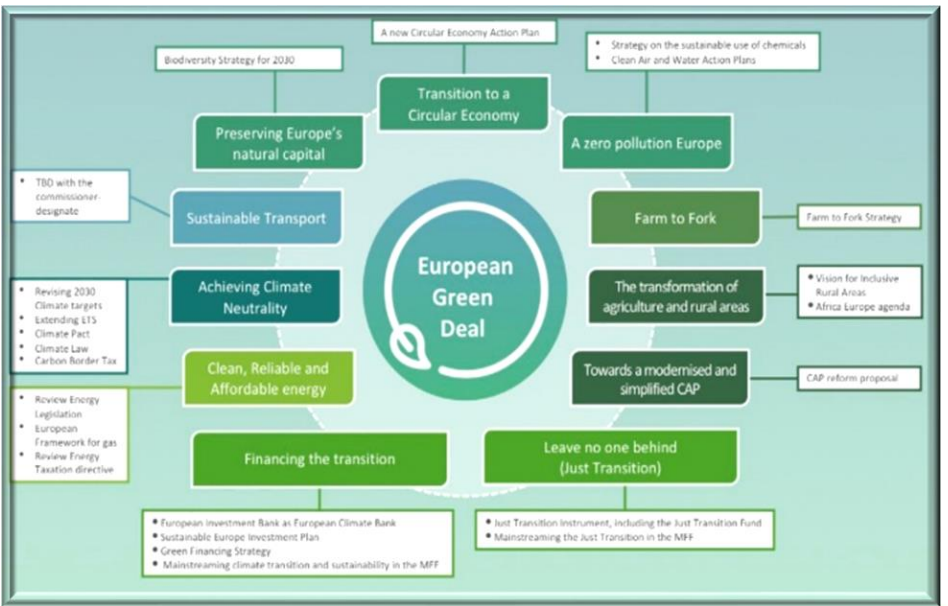

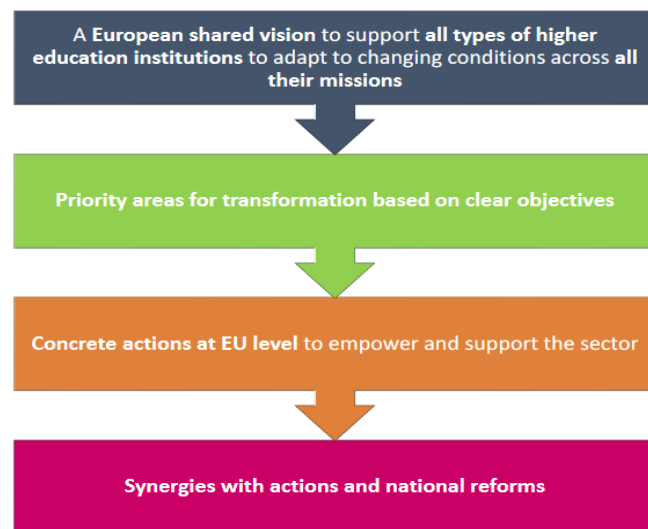

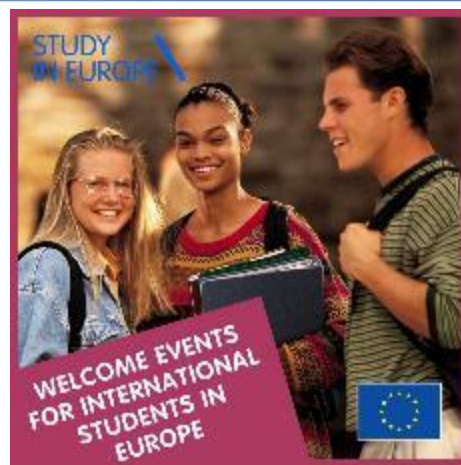

- 1. Mobility projects – building trust** at personal, institutional levels and Ukraine!!!
 - Establish contacts and discuss cooperation, learn how to present your institution, how to communicate about your university/organisation needs (SWOT).
 - Learn how the international cooperation is organised, what procedures and mechanisms are established, learn how to write proposals and do it together.
