

- Human losses among students teaching and admin staff
- 3798 education institutions damaged, 365 destroyed completely
- War affected 1.5 million young Ukrainians, over 70,000 foreign students
- Many HEIs have served as shelters and humanitarian hubs
- International officers and projects teams&families under danger in occupied territories
- 34 HEIs, 65 units of HEIs and 45 VET institutions temporarily relocated
- Teaching and learning process: from shelters, frontlines and abroad (online/offline/blended formats)



- ✓ Based on its Academic/organisational Freedom it is up to the Erasmus Universities and other organisations on how to apply it.
- ✓ At least make sure that they share European values and do not support war! It is nothing to do with politics!
- ✓ Please do the right choice choose people from Ukraine, we are defending the future of Europe!
- ✓ PLEASE DO NOT provide similarities via joint support platforms for Ukrainians, Russians, and Belarusians: do not equal those suffering from a bloody war with those whose governments directly support war and terrorism 'victims of war' ≠ 'victims of totalitarian regime'.







Education process restarted on 14 March 2022 in distance/blended/offline!!!

- ✓ 24 regions of Ukraine are providing education in distance learning format!

- ✓ 34 higher education institutions, 65 HEI affiliated units and
 45 professional pre-higher educational institutions were displaced.

√ 167 professional pre-higher and higher education institutions were damaged,

and 24 institutions were destroyed.

562 290 students applied for higher education in 2023

71 786 students confirmed for budget funding in 2023.

1,4 mln. students applied for higher education in 2024.

Universities strengthened their internationalisation priorities and widened cooperation, opened campuses!



Ukraine's Education system 2024 (Education components)









Recognition of Academic (Credit) Mobility and Qualifications



Recognition of higher education qualifications within the Higher Education system is carried out in accordance with the <u>Law on Higher</u> Education - by the decision of the Academic Council of the HEI.

Within Erasmus+ projects, Inter-Institutional Agreement is a <u>MUST</u> to organise official mobility and recognition of learning outcomes and mobility periods.

<u>Recommendation</u>: to have internal mobility regulations to avoid internal risks regarding the recognition of learning outcomes.

Bologna Process implementation and key reforms since 2014



> 2019-2022

- NAQA prepared for entry into ENQA/EQAR
- PhD reform adoption of a new legal framework for dissertation defenses and PhD study
- Strategy for the Higher Education Development in Ukraine 2032 (approved on February 23, 2022, the Cabinet of Ministers) is developed in line with European Integration prospects as well as EHEA principles.
- Regulation on Mobility (updated in May 2022, the Cabinet of Ministers) internships (for practical skills development) and language internships were added as forms of academic mobility, the right to mobility was extended to VET students.
- List of Fields of Study and Programme Subject Areas in Higher Education based on the Fields of Education and Training 2013 (ISCED-F 2013) (updating in 2022, the Ministry) 29 Fields of Study (Narrow fields of education and training, ISCED) and 122 Programme Subject Areas (Detailed fields of education and training, ISCED)





Higher Education reforming in Ukraine

- Law on Individual Learning Pathway (approved, 2024): expanding the opportunities of students to form individual learning pathways, as well as expanding the autonomy of higher education institutions in the development and implementation of interdisciplinary study programmes, recognition of nonformal/informal education
- **Draft Law on Academic Integrity** taken as a basis within the first reading in the Parliament in June 2024
- The Draft Law on Amendments to the Law of Ukraine "On Higher Education" on expanding the rights of student self-governance bodies and ensuring the rights of students was registered in the Parliament (No. 10279)





Higher Education reforming in Ukraine

- State funding for HEIs based on criteria (2024)
 - **contingent of students** the total number of students who study at the expense of the state funding
 - **research activity** the amount of funds (calculated per academic employee) that HEI earned from the provision of research and consulting services or received in the form of grants for research
 - **internationalization** place in international University ranks and/or participation in Erasmus+ projects
 - employment the percentage of graduates who are employed (data from the Pension Fund)
 - **regional coefficient** to support HEIs in the most vulnerable, currently front-line regions







International cooperation during martial law April 2022 – September 2024: increased internationalisation

- √ 94 projects for capacity building in higher education.
- ✓ 223 projects for European Studies
- ✓ 1000 other projects in education, youth and sport
- ✓ relocated russian budget to Ukraine


Issues which might be addressed in the course of the peer support are:

- quality assurance in compliance with the Standards and Guidelines for Quality Assurance in the European Higher Education Area



Impact

/ FOCUS UKRAINE

The main impact of the project was the provision of targeted and specific support to the participating countries to establish ESG-compliant QA agencies and to thereby improve the country's implementation of the Bologna Key Commitment on QA. The project therefore had a direct impact on supporting the EHEA and the collaboration of HEIs within it since it tackled the work of QA agencies (and thus the related HE systems within which they operate) that are not yet compliant with the ESG.





Peer Support to Higher Education Reform Projects

- To find contact information of the HEIs for mobility/ cooperation
- Force Majeure Circumstances: suspend or continue with redesigning
- Staff safety, activities delays, changes, workplan/ activities etc.
- Institutional regulation for Mobility does not reflect the war time: not ready for flexibility
- Recognition by the EU universities of prior study or belonging to the university without the documents which were lost/destroyed during war/ recognition for mobility periods
- Study/Traineeship for 1st year students, 4th year students longer semester, exam, diploma
- Ad hock courses and not relevant to the subject area (impossible to recognize)
- Teaching, Training, Job shadowing for staff (focus on institutional impact)
- Delays with documents for permission to staff, researchers and students mobility
- Crossing the border procedures for specific categories of students and staff
- Passport, visa and crossing the border during martial law
- Temporary protection status vs students visa etc.

Inter-Institutional Agreement is a must to organise official mobility and recognition!!!

RUSSIA'S WAR ON UKRAINE: UKRAINIAN STUDENTS IN THE EU



Russia's invasion of Ukraine on 24 February 2022 has caused vast displacement of people within the country as well as across the EU borders. While the annexation of Crimea had a negative impact on the country's education system, recent events have added additional strain.

Outbound student mobility was already substantial in recent years, but it has accelerated even further since the Crimean conflict began. After doubling from some 25 000 to nearly 50 000 between 2007 and 2014, the number of Ukrainian students abroad has since skyrocketed by another 54 % to around 78 000 in 2019.

Approximately 49 000 Ukrainian students were attending various higher education institutions across the EU in 2019. This means that approximately 60 % of the 78 000 Ukrainians studying abroad worldwide in 2019 chose to study in the EU. The countries welcoming the highest numbers of students are Poland, Germany, Czechia and Slovakia.

Some 480 Ukrainian students are currently engaged in Erasmus+ activities via the programme's international strand. In the 2015-2019 programming period, Ukraine received 40 % of the available funding in the Eastern Partnership region, and over 9 000 Ukrainian students and staff participated in more than 1 300 Erasmus projects.

Following the Russian invasion of Ukraine, Commissioner Mariya Gabriel announced, on 2 March 2022, that the Commission would grant maximum flexibility in the implementation of Erasmus+ projects involving Ukrainian

higher education students and staff, National Erasmus agencies can apply the force majeure clause for international mobility activities taking place in Ukraine and Russia. This will allow beneficiaries to cancel, postpone or rearrange planned activities in the most flexible way possible.

In addition, the Commission has invited Erasmus national agencies and participating organisations to contact beneficiaries who are currently located in Ukraine or Russia



Number of young people studying worldwide







Cooperation focus ideas

The key areas of international cooperation between universities in wartime are the quality of higher education and research and ensuring equal access to quality education (inclusion), primarily through the digitalization of higher education.

Reforming such aspects of university activities requires the modernisation of governance and management in higher education, the improvement of learning and teaching excellence based on the study and implementation of national and European best practices.

For Ukraine, the urgent task is to build strategies for the post-war reconstruction of various sectors of the economy in the context of European integration and their implementation, so the role of universities as drivers of the development of an innovative society, research and expert centers is significant.

Thus, university cooperation in the fields of research and innovation, in particular their commercialization, as well as the development of human capital, is extremely necessary to achieve the goals and objectives of the post-war reconstruction of the country as well as negotiators for the EU membership conditions and their implementation.

A separate focus of international cooperation in higher education should be focused on the field of health care, as it is critically important to develop the latest approaches and methods for diagnosing and treating war victims, both military and civilian; physical and psychological rehabilitation of adults and children under martial law.







Steps for changes and impact – KA1. ICM, VET, EVE, Youth

- 1. Mobility projects building trust at personal, institutional levels and Ukraine!!!
- Establish contacts and discuss cooperation, learn how to present your institution, how to communicate about your university/organisation needs (SWOT).




