1. Summary of CB VET action



AIM

Capacity building projects are **international cooperation projects** based on multilateral partnerships between organisations active in the field of VET in:

- EU Member States
- Third countries associated to the Programme
- Third countries not associated to the Programme

They aim to support the

- Relevance
- Accessibility
- Responsiveness

of VET institutions and systems in third countries not associated to the Programme





OBJECTIVES

- Build capacity of VET providers to strengthen cooperation between private and public stakeholders in VET for demandoriented and opportunity-driven VET interventions;
- Improve the quality and responsiveness of VET to economic and social developments to enhance the labour market relevance of skills provision;
- Align VET provision to local, regional and national development strategies.



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ACTIVITIES

Building and strengthening the capacities of organisations active in the field of VET principally in the third countries not associated to the Programme covered by the action

For example:

- Creating and developing networks and exchanges of good practice between VET providers
- Creating tools, programmes and other materials to build the capacity of institutions from third countries not associated to the Programme
- Creating mechanisms to involve private sector (design and delivery of curricula, work-based experience)
- Developing and transferring pedagogical approaches, teaching and training materials and methods, including work based learning, virtual mobility, open educational resources and better exploitation of the ICT potential
- Attention: Developing and implementing international (virtual) exchange activities for staff primarily

- Not enough partners
- Not enough countries
- More organisations from EU+third countries associated to Programme THAN organisations from third countries NOT associated to Programme
- Attention not an eligibility criteria, but good to know:
 - Part B Description of the action max. 70 pages

Erasmus+ Programme Guide

Eligible participating organisations:

- Vocational education and training providers
- Other public or private organisations active in the field of VET or in the labour market (non-exhaustive list):
 - * VET providers;
 - * Companies, industry or sector representative organisations;
 - * National/regional qualification authorities;
 - * Employment services ;
 - * Research institutes;
 - * Innovation agencies;
 - * Regional development authorities etc.



What types of organisations can participate?

Erasmus+ Programme Guide

ATTENTION: WHO CAN BE APPLICANT/COORDINATOR ?

Any public and private organisation active in the VET field and legally established in an EU Member State or eligible third country associated to the Programme. Organisations from third countries **not** associated to the Programme **cannot** be coordinators.

ATTENTION: The consortium must include at least one VET provider at non-tertiary education level.

3. How to find coordinator/partner



Finding coordinator/partner – Try different ways

- 1. If you already have contacts with VET providers in EU or third countries associated to the Erasmus+ Programme, get in touch with them **to check if they plan to apply** under this action.
- Contact European networks of VET Providers (e.g. EVTA, EVBB, EfVET, EUproVET) and networks that represent higher education institutions also active in the field of VET (e.g. EURASHE, EUCEN). EVBB – European Association of Institutes of Vocational Training- <u>https://evbb.eu/</u> reconfirmed to us its willingness to help to find coordinator/partner in EU on 25/10/2023.
- 3. Organisation active in **lifelong guidance, counselling, learning mobility and career management** contact the European network <u>Euroguidance</u>.
- 4. Involve other Ukrainian organizations make your project stronger.
- As Ukrainina organisation think to involve other organizations from the same region 3 Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Moldova – it might be they have contacts to organizations from EU/third countries associated to the programme.



Finding coordinator/partner – Try different ways

- Erasmus+ VET-related projects (2014-2020) on the <u>Erasmus+ Project Results Platform</u>. Please use the 'advanced search', selecting Erasmus+ Programme and within the different actions please focus on vocational education and training.
- Use the section "Partner search announcements" <u>https://ec.europa.eu/info/funding-tenders/opportunities/portal/screen/how-to-participate/partner-search</u> in the Funding & Tenders Opportunities Portal (FTOP)
- 8. **Contact Ukrainian VET experts** you know it might they help you to find coordinator/partner.

- 11. The <u>Katapult Network</u> includes a network and matchmaking tool to build relationships with new partners. The direct link to the matchmaking tool is <u>here</u>. <u>How does it work?</u>
- 12. If you are a member of the European Training Foundation (ETF) Open Space, you may look for partners <u>there</u>. In particular, you may contact the <u>Network run by the European Training Foundation</u> (ETF) that includes numerous VET centers in Europe and ETF partner countries as well as the <u>ETF</u> Quality Assurance forum that involves more than 20 countries. In this context, you may consult the <u>ETF regions and countries</u>.

4. Tips for applicants/shortcomings of submitted applications



TIPS FOR APPLICANTS

- Start today



- Strategy, create idea, own team, decide about coordinator and partners
- Check model of application from last year
 - <u>PART B Description of the action only for an inspiration</u>
 - Excel budget table only for an inspiration

- ATTENTION: These documents are ONLY for an inspiration. They might be slightly changed for your call.
- Be inspired by successful projects check their project web pages
- Improve your project and re-submitted it (if it was not selected last year)



TIPS FOR APPLICANTS



- Answer each guiding point of each 4 award criteria (see in the Programme guide) – **example for an inspiration**

– valid for Link to thematic areas: the relevance of the proposal to the objectives and thematic areas of Guidina the last year the action: Regional priorities: the proposal addresses the regional priorities, including relevant policy documents listed under this action; Local context: the proposal is based on an adequate needs analysis and feasible in the local context of the targeted country(/ies); Consistency: the objectives of the application are clearly defined, realistic and address issues Award criterion relevant to the participating organisations and target groups; Relevance of Innovation: the proposal considers state-of-the-art methods and techniques, and leads to the project innovative results and solutions for its field in general, or for the geographical context in which the project is implemented (e.g. content; outputs produced, working methods applied, (maximum organisations and persons involved or targeted); score 30 Complementarity: the proposal is complementary to other initiatives already carried out by points) the participating organisations; Capacity building: the capacity building activities are clearly defined and aim at reinforcing the capacities, principally of the participating organisations from third countries not associated to the Programme; Link to strategies: the activities inscribe themselves in the development strategies of the targeted VET providers and support strategies at country level, including a greater attention to employability, inclusion, diversity and socio-economically disadvantaged participants where relevant; Horizontal aspects: the horizontal aspects of the Programme are taken into consideration.



GOOD PROJECT

- **Clear needs analysis** (concrete for your project, for participants, partner from all third countries **not** associated to the Programme)
- In line with policy documents (see the Programme guide)
- In line with regional priorities (see the Programme guide)
- Deliverables linked to capacity builling (clearly supporting capacity in VET)
- Relevant consortium (including players in VET, world of work, decision makers)
- Realistic impact (explaining what will your project change in VET)
- Balanced EU grant (remember: focus is on third countries not associated to Programme)



Feedback from our monitoring



- Projects which have done an impactful Needs Analysis have a more focused/easier implementation
- Projects which deliver impact for the VET providers are particularly of interest for Feedback to Policy
- **Deliverables** (rather quality than quantity)
- Communication/Dissemination/stakeholder engagement starts as of day one: cover it in the proposal and 2-3 deliverables accompanying the implementation.
- Partner constellations: Big consortia are more difficult to manage; those consortia which manage to establish already at proposal-stage a thorough and detailed collaboration have it easier in the implementation.

SUCCESSFUL PROJECT



- \checkmark **Be coherent:** avoid contradictions and "cut and paste" style applications
- \checkmark **Be concrete:** use examples, justify your claims, provide evidence
- \checkmark Be clear: read the questions carefully, provide information in the correct order as indicated in the form
- ✓ **Be explicit:** take nothing for granted; don't assume that experts have prior knowledge; avoid abbreviations or explain them
- ✓ **Be realistic:** the application is the basis of your project to be; it is also the cornerstone of the commitment you will sign
- \checkmark **Remain focused**: concentrate exclusively on what is asked of you
- ✓ Eligibility: make sure you have followed all instructions and that the proposal meets all mandatory requirements
- √ Keep it simple: use short sentences, vary the length if you wish to make it more interesting but keep it simple and focused
