


On the way to the new projects...

The call for applications for studying at the Estonian University of Life Sciences in spring semester 2023-2024 has been launched.

Training directions: all subject areas presented at the Estonian University of Life Sciences.

Who can apply: students (enrolled at least at 3rd year of studies).

Funding: 800 euro monthly and 275 euro for travel.

How to apply

Please be aware that the Exchange students are required to take courses for at least 15 ECTS per semester. There is no maximum limit.

If you are interested in participation in this programme, please complete the application form: https://forms.gle/aEBfRfzyrVEfm4mM6 , you will need to download the following documents while completing the form:

- CV (in English)
- Motivation letter (in English);
- Transcript of records (from the very first semester up to the present day) or diploma;
- Language certificate (certificate of English proficiency) if available;
- Copy of international passport (1st page).
- Additional document (if available).

Sumy State University will provide a selection of candidates according to the following criteria:

- Grade point average (based on the submitted transcript of records) 5 points;
- Language skills (minimum B2 language proficiency is required) 5 points;
- Motivation, additional certificates etc. 5 points.

The priority will be given to the applicants with disabilities, difficult socio-economic situations, or those, who suffered from the war.



- Confirmation from the host university

Challenges and Recommendations

Synergy of academic and administrative staff work:

- academic (fields of studies, quotas, categories, mobility content);
- administrative (documentations, deadlines)

Clear agreements of partners before launching mobility:

- lists of courses/modules offered and recognition procedures;
- eligibility and other selection criteria

<u>Provision for open access and transparent selections:</u>

- -effective set of tools for wide dissemination;
- extended selection committees, including students

Challenges and Recommendations

Focus on the incoming mobility:

- design of attractive programmes in English;
- supporting services for incoming participants (adaptation, accommodation, mentoring)

Thorough monitoring of on-going mobilities:

- regular meetings and collection of feedback;
- evaluation of learning/training progress.

Creation of Erasmus Community:

- -programme alumni;
- platform for communication (forum, website, social nets)
