



Education: a Pillar of Society

- String theory suggests nature's fundamental building blocks are not particles but tiny, vibrating interacting strings.
- Similarly, education is an interconnected framework where individual components impact all layers of society—countries, institutions, people, children, and companies.
- Project EdUkraine embodies these diverse facets of education.



Project EdUkraine

- Ukrainian students studying German are spending a semester at PH OÖ in Linz for full-time teaching practice.
- They teach Ukrainian children, assist Austrian teachers with integration challenges, and help Ukrainian children adapt to Austrian society.
- This experience benefits their future careers.



Experts from Partner Universities

- Ukrainian professors and experts from partner universities are invited with a grant to our university in Linz for:
 - Scientific exchange
 - Supporting Austrian teachers working with Ukrainian children as well as students through trainings, lectures, and consultations
 - Discussing problems and improving pupil learning conditions
 - Advising on the research part of the project



Research

- The project aims to analyze the living and learning environments of Ukrainian children and their families.
- Qualitative methods like interviews with and observations of children, parents, and Austrian teachers will be used.
- Ukrainian students will assist in ensuring practical access to the research field.
- The results will be published.



Conception of the Project

- The project was motivated by the educational needs of children fleeing the Ukrainian warzone.
- The PH OÖ, a university for teacher education, is committed to Civic Engagement and Third Mission.
- It was inspired by a similar project at the University of Education Vienna by Thomas Bauer, who provided valuable advice.
- Funding from the Erasmus+ KA171 Program provided a platform to realize the project.



The Austrian National Agency OeAD

- Andreas Wenninger of the OeAD Cooperation Office Lviv advised and helped with identifying three Ukrainian universities.
- Representatives of the Austrian National Agency OeAD have effectively helped with the grant application and have provided professional assistance to the project EdUkraine on a consistent basis.

Collaboration of the Universities

- This three-year project involves continuous collaboration among leaders, professors, and international coordinators of the participating universities.
- They are planning strategic approaches, future visits, and a publication based on the research results.

Educational Board of Upper Austria



- The PH OÖ partnered with the Educational Board of Upper Austria to contact six local schools (4 primary and 2 middle schools) with Ukrainian children.
- Ukrainian students assist in these classrooms.
- More schools have expressed interest in having practice students assigned, highlighting the need for support.







Background, Idea and Overall Aim

- Loss of academic talent and potential because of casualties, displacement, expert emigration, and disruption of educational services
- Academic freedom (freedom to learn, teach, research and disseminate research outcomes) essential to democracy and a society based on the rule of law and the respect for human rights
- Support for Ukrainian partners and members of academia to improve academic freedom









WP 2 - Objective 1



"Getting a clear picture"

What?

Assess the displacement of members of academia of Ukrainian partner universities to understand where displaced members of academia are and whether and how they are still engaged with academic life

Why?

In order to understand the current situation of Ukrainian partner universities and how the displacement of academia might impact the Ukrainian higher education sector in the future (see WP 4) there is a need to know the ambitions, needs and future visions of displaced members of academia

How?

Baseline study on about Motives, Conditions, and Perspectives of Displaced Members of Academia concerning their Future Careers (Activity 2.1)

Online Survey distributed by Ukrainian partners to displaced members of academia (July-end of September)





WP 2 – Objective 2



"Creating Networks"

What?

(Re-) establish links between Ukrainian partner universities and their displaced members of academia and create a network between Ukrainian partners and European HEI.

Why?

In order to be full members of the European Higher Education Area it is crucial for Ukrainian universities to build sustainable networks.

Networks will furthermore help to mitigate negative impacts on partner universities in the field of teaching (WP 3)

How?

Establishment of a Free-Ac Network linking Ukrainian partner universities with European HEI



WP 2 – Objective 3



"Being prepared"

What?

Provide European HEI with some best practice examples how to best respond to forced displacement and integrate displaced members of academia at HEI


Why?

European HEI were taken off guard when displacement started and structural approaches to support displaced members of academia were lacking

How?

"Best Practice Manual" on how to respond to situations of displacement \rightarrow 4 national reports fuel a set of recommendations (A2.8)





Objectives and Activities WP 3

"Teaching and Learning"







WP 3 - Objective 1



"Fill teaching gaps"

What?

Support Ukrainian partners to uphold educational processes

Why?

Because of the Russian invasion the subsequent displacement of teaching staff arguably resulted in difficulties in upholding teaching offers necessary that students within and outside Ukraine can accomplish their studies

How?

Analyse the situation at Ukrainian partner universities with a large scale survey and identify the most pressing teaching gaps (A3.2-3.3) "Bridging" gaps \rightarrow guest lectures by EU partners and HEI from the network (10 lectures/workshops etc / Ukrainian partner)



WP 3 – Objective 2



"Continue learning from each other"

What?

Support Ukrainian students from partner universities and displaced members of academia to learn about "Academic Freedom", get in contact and engage with fellow students from EU partner and network universities

Why?

Because of the Russian invasion Ukrainian students faced a disruption in study progress. We want to offer them a possibility to get to know more about freedom of academia and human rights of members of academia in conflict situations

How?





WP 4 - Objective 1



"Be part of the research community"

What?

Support researchers from Ukrainian partner universities to remain members of the academic research community and to present their research activities, connect them with other researchers and have their voices heard

Why?

Because of the Russian invasion Ukrainian researchers faced considerable constraints in possibilities to disseminate their research results and present their research activities to a larger audience

How?

Organization of 12 hybrid guest lectures by Ukrainian researchers at EU partner or network universities



WP 4 – Objective 2



"What next?"

What?

Develop ideas and recommendations for re-building the higher education system in Ukraine based on the experiences of the Consortium in other post-conflict situations (Bosnia and Kosovo)

Why?

In order to support Ukraine in re-building the higher education sector lessons learned from other situations can be useful to improve the development of post-war strategic outlooks.

How?

Study on the negative impacts of the war on the higher education system in Ukraine and a strategic outlook based on the study and multi-stakeholder workshop on the future of the Ukrainian higher education system.





- At this point, 39 projects are funded in Horizon Europe, which involve organisations from both countries. Broad range of organisations: mainly HEIs, research organisations and private sector
- 26 projects involve Higher Education Institutions from Austria or Ukraine → see list left hand
- HEU instruments with the participation AT & UA: MSCA, Infrastructure, European Innovation Council / EIE, Cluster 5 (Climate, Energy and Mobility), Cluster 6 (Food, Bioeconomy, Natrual Resources, Agriculture and Environment), Cluster 4 (Digital, Industry and Space), Cluster 2 (Culture, Creativity and Inclusive Society), Mission Ocean, Mission Clima, Mission Cancer
- All fields areas of research, strong links with industry / companies and non-academic organisations in the broadest sense

EXAMPLE PROJECT LOC3G: LOCALIZATION IN GEOPHYSICS, GEOHAZARDS AND GEOENGINEERING



• LOG3G seeks to advance and share the knowledge of the multiscale and multiphysics modelling of localization phenomena in geomaterials (soils and rocks), with the aim to create predictive models serving the communities in geophysics, geohazards, and geoengineering

- 1.52 million euro funding, duration March 2024 February 2028

Funded by Marie Skłodowska-Curie Staff Exchange

- 4 years duration
- substantial funding for staff exchange (through secondments), research, training and networking costs, management
- secondments must be international, intersectoral or interdisciplinary
- duration of secondments is between 1-12 months per staff member, split secondments are possible

- The most internationally open research programme in the world.
- A unique international R&I funding programme of such scale and scope.

- Association to Horizon Europe is possible for countries anywhere in the world, but based on (certain and strict) criteria.
 - Association of a third country to Horizon Europe is not a prerequisite for participation in the programme




Ukraine Participation in Horizon EuropeKey Figures


Ukraine Participation in Horizon EuropeCooperation with Austria






Ukraine Participation in Horizon EuropeCollaboration Links with EU Member States






Ukraine Participation in Horizon Europe Collaboration Links with EU Member States

Horizon Europe Hop-on facility



Policy Background/Objectives

- Improve Inclusiveness of Horizon Europe by involving additional research institutions from Widening countries (→ Ukraine) in Horizon Europe Pillar 2 Cluster projects and EIC Pathfinder actions;
- Contribute to the 'advancing Europe package' negotiated in the legislative process for Horizon Europe;
- Open up closed networks and overcome barriers;
- Contribute to reducing the participation gap in Horizon Europe and closing the innovation divide in Europe.

Who?

- A consortium funded under Pillar 2 or the EIC Pathfinder actions of Horizon Europe with a <u>valid grant agreement</u>, but with <u>no partner from a Widening country</u>;
- A legal entity (organization) from a Widening Country wishing to join this collaborative R&I action (only RIA and not CSA or IA).

How?

- The proposal must be submitted by the (Austrian) coordinator of the consortium funded under Pillar 2 of Horizon Europe;
- All consortium partners need to agree on the accession of the new partner;
- The proposal should include a detailed description of the profile of the new partner and its role in the existing project and the R&I relevance and complementarity needs to be demonstrated;
- The additional partner and task should be described in a dedicated proposal template, DoA of parent project to be annexed
- → amendment of the existing grant agreement necessary!

! Preference will be given to proposals with a particular relevance to green or digital transitions of the economy!

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




