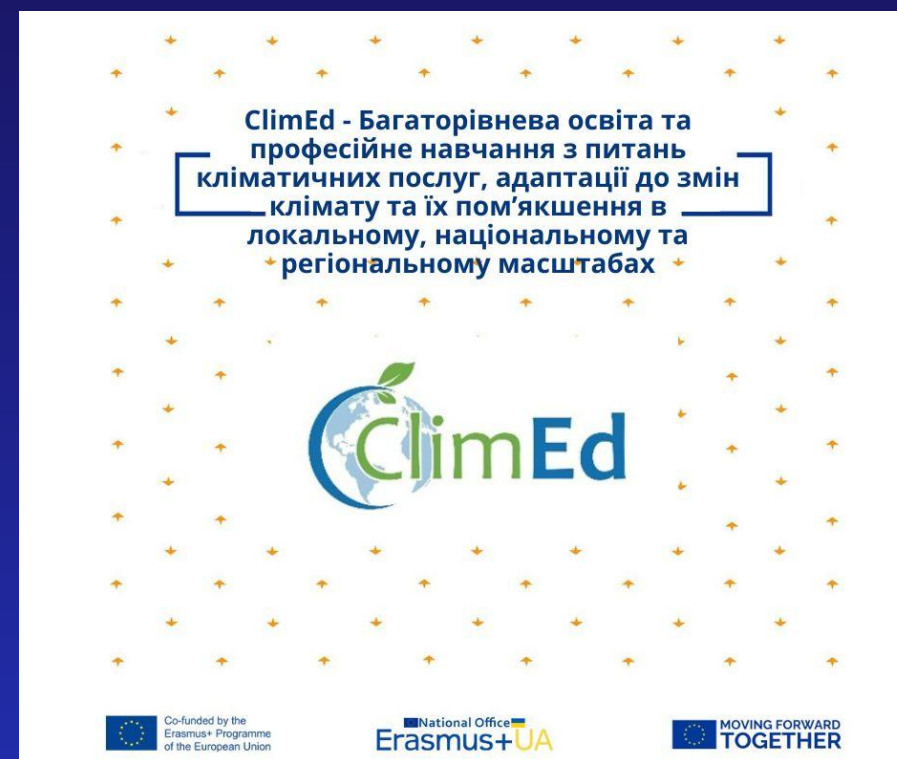

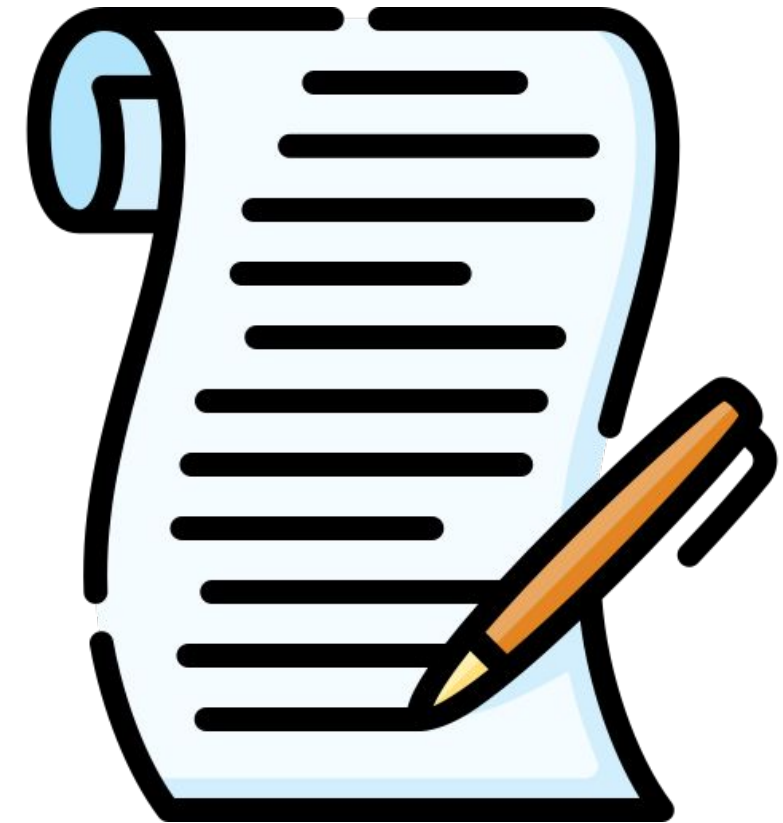


Procedure for Attracting, Use, and Monitoring of International Technical Assistance

Approved by Resolution of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine No. 153 dated February 15, 2002

- **International technical assistance** is financial and other resources and services that, in accordance with international agreements of Ukraine, are provided by development partners on a free and non-refundable basis to support Ukraine;
- **Project beneficiary** is a **central executive authority** or another institution responsible for development and/or implementation of state policy in the sector or region where the project is planned, and is **interested in the project outcomes**.





State Registration of Projects (Programs)

- **ITA state registration** is mandatory (item 11 of the Procedure).
- Registration is performed by the **Secretariat of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine - SCMU** (item 13 of the Procedure).
- **Project implementers (recipients)** submit request to the public authority (**MoES Ukraine**) for confirmation to become a beneficiary of the project.
- The **beneficiary (MoES Ukraine)** submits a **letter of support** to the SCMU for project registration.





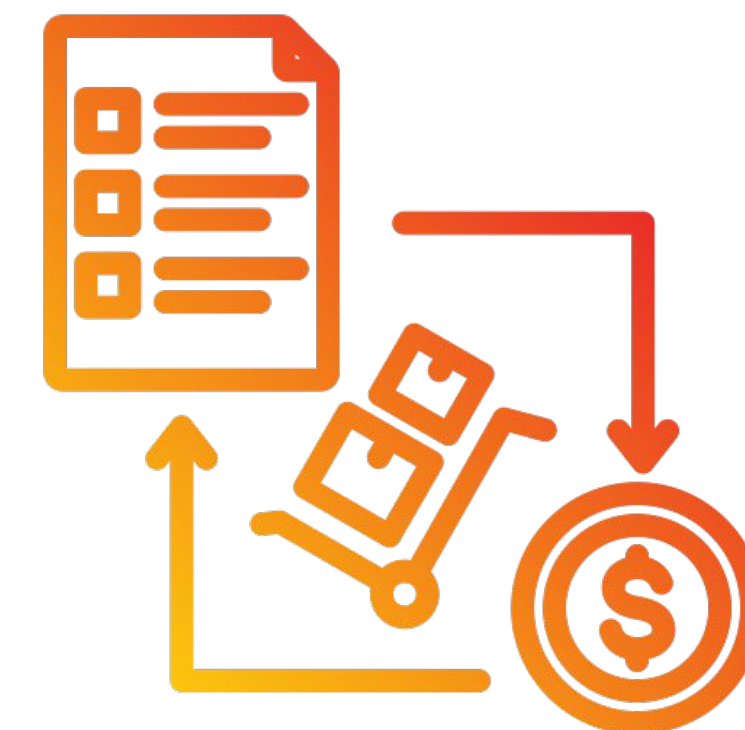
International technical assistance



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Procurement Planning

- The **procurement plan** for goods, works, and services financed by international technical assistance must be **approved if the beneficiary also acts as the recipient (item 9 of the Procedure)**.



Key ITA Project Registration Requirements

(to be provided in the letter of request)

- Full project name in UA and EN, including the grantholder's project number (if applicable).
- Full name of the Development partner.
- Details on executing organization and recipient institution (contact person, position, phone, email).
- Project Implementation period (start and end dates of the project).
- Total project budget and grant amount allocated specifically for Ukraine.
- Project goals, objectives, and expected results.
- Compliance of the project with national strategic documents (e.g., Cabinet of Ministers Program, EU-UA Association Agreement, regional or sectoral strategies).

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ITA Monitoring - procedure to review the state of project (program) implementation

Types of ITA Monitoring

- Ongoing (semi-annual and annual reports)
- Final monitoring

Reporting Deadlines

- **By July 10** for semi-annual monitoring (covering **January 1 – June 30** period).
- **By January 10** of the following year for annual monitoring (covering **January 1 – December 31** period).

Failure to submit monitoring reports is considered as **unsatisfactory** project implementation (item 27 of the Procedure).
